ADMISSION PROCEDURES

TRANSIENT STATUS

Communications regarding courses, attendance as a transient student, and requests for a transient application should be addressed to the Office of the Registrar. An individual desiring to study as a transient student must submit a completed transient application and written certification of good standing from the institution in which the student is regularly enrolled, signed by the student's Registrar or Academic Dean. These documents must be submitted and approved by the Huntingdon College Registrar (334-833-4522) prior to registration for any summer session.

ADMISSION AS A FRESHMAN OR TRANSFER STUDENT

A person who plans to apply for admission as a freshman or transfer student and initiates attendance during the summer should contact the Office of Admission (334-833-4497 or 800-763-0313) for application procedures and an application packet in advance of the opening date of the summer session.

¹ Room & Board will consist of housing in Ligon Dorm and one meal per day in the Russell Dining facility. The Dining Hall will be open from 11:00A.M. to 12:30P.M. every day, and will be periodically open for breakfast and dinner when dictated for utilization of outside groups. Extra meals can be purchased at the door, but there will be no carry over of unused meals from one day to the next. Students will not have the option to put money on their card during the Summer term for meals. The board portion is not optional. If a student chooses not to eat the one meal per day, the student will still be charged the entire Room & Board rate for the 6 week term. Students will be allowed to move in on May 21, 2008, and will be required to move out on July 3, 2008.

PAYMENT POLICY

Payment is due in full by the first day of classes and will be considered late if not received by the 30th. Students who have not paid in full by the deadline will be placed on the Summer Deferred Payment Plan for a fee of \$100, and will have until August 1st to pay the balance in full. MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATION

All student vehicles must be registered with the Campus Security Office. A \$10 per year registration fee is charged students who park or drive a vehicle on campus. Campus Security will issue a parking decal, which must be prominently displayed, and provide parking regulations when a vehicle is registered. The College reserves the right to ticket or tow vehicles in violation of the parking regulations. Parking fines must be paid before transcripts will be released.

ACADEMIC POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

A typical load is six semester hours per session. Permission to exceed a six hour load is limited to students with exceptionally good grade records, and must be secured from the Dean of the Faculty. Summer Session classes meet five days a week, Monday through Friday, for seventy five minutes. A student may not add a class after it has met more than twice.

³ The end of Registration Period indicates the point at which the College will begin to determine which courses will be offered and which will be cancelled based on enrollment. Eligible students will be permitted to register after the end of the Registration Period until the end of the Drop/Add period.
