ADMISSION PROCEDURES

TRANSIENT STATUS

Communications regarding courses, attendance as a transient student, and requests for a transient application should be addressed to the Office of the Registrar. An individual desiring to study as a transient student must submit a completed transient application and written certification of good standing from the institution in which the student is regularly enrolled, signed by the student's Registrar or Academic Dean. These documents must be submitted and approved by the Huntingdon College Registrar (334-833-4553) prior to registration for any summer session.

ADMISSION AS A FRESHMAN OR TRANSFER STUDENT

A person who plans to apply for admission as a freshman or transfer student and initiates attendance during the summer should contact the Office of Admission (334-833-4497 or 800-763-0313) for application procedures and an application packet in advance of the opening date of the summer session.

¹ Room & Board will consist of housing in Blount Residence Hall and one meal per day in the Russell Dining facility. The Dining Hall will be open from 11:00A.M. to 12:30 p.m. every day, and will be periodically open for breakfast and dinner when dictated for utilization of outside groups. Extra meals can be purchased at the door, but there will be no carry over of unused meals from one day to the next. The board portion is not optional. If a student chooses not to eat the one meal per day, the student will still be charged the entire Room & Board rate for the session. Only students taking at least 3 hours per session will be permitted to occupy campus housing. Space is limited, so students taking 6 hours or more per session will be given priority. Summer Session I students will be allowed to move in on Sunday, May 16, 2010, and will be required to move out on Wednesday, June 23, 2010. Summer Session II students will be allowed to move in Monday, July 5, 2010, and will be required to move out on Wednesday, August 11, 2010.

PAYMENT POLICY

Payment is due in full by the first day of classes (Monday, May 17th) and will be considered late if not received by Friday, May 21st. Students who have not paid in full by the deadline will be placed on the Summer Deferred Payment Plan for a fee of \$100, and will have until August 1st to pay the balance in full. MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATION

All student vehicles must be registered with the Campus Security Office. A \$10 per year registration fee is charged students who park or drive a vehicle on campus. Campus Security will issue a parking decal, which must be prominently displayed, and provide parking regulations when a vehicle is registered. The College reserves the right to ticket or tow vehicles in violation of the parking regulations. Parking fines must be paid before transcripts will be released.

ACADEMIC POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

A typical load is six semester hours per session. Permission to exceed a six hour load is limited to students with exceptionally good grade records, and must be secured from the Dean of the Faculty. Three credit-hour Summer Session classes meet four days a week, Monday through Thursday, for one hour and forty five minutes. A student may not add a class after it has met twice.
